Highlights

The following highlights give a short summary of the most important changes, added functionality, and improvements:

- Implemented possibility to set the map center before map engine initialization. Previously map was always launched in Berlin, and as a result additional unnecessary map data were requested

- Implemented route importer as a feature which provides an opportunity to create a custom route object from the route shape, particularly from a list of geo-coordinates (lat, lon)

New Features

The following list contains new features in the current release of HERE Android SDK:

HERE SDK 3.12

- Exposed information about traffic signs on a route through HERE SDK
- Implemented route importer as a feature which provides an opportunity to create a custom route object from the route shape, particularly from a list of geo-coordinates (lat, lon)
- Truck navigation is aligned with routing truck restrictions, and current behavior takes into account truck restriction options PENALIZE_VIOLATIONS. The route is calculated properly, but the user gets a warning that it could be fined
- POI icons are now easily tappable
- Implemented possibility to set the map center before map engine initialization. Previously map was always launched in Berlin, and as a result additional unnecessary map data were requested
- Improved determination of waypoint position, now waypoints are defined by position and street name
- Implemented caching mechanism for bitmap-based render tiles on low zoom levels
- Navigation Manager was extended to get indoor position during navigation. Now NavigationManager gets updates from all sources that provide switchover between indoor and outdoor navigation
- Map Matcher mechanism has been significantly improved. Main improvements were focused on 4 aggregated cases corner jumps, rounded corner jumps, parallel roads and tunnels. This feature will be available in HERE SDK as beta feature

Table 2: Limitations and Workarounds

#	Limitation	Workaround
1	On Android 4.2 or earlier devices, zooming out to the lowest level, where the Globe is visible, can cause the map to freeze.	Use Android 4.3 or higher devices to avoid this behavior.
2	Users may encounter map loading issues on Samsung devices that have Power Saving mode enabled. A blank map may appear instead.	To avoid this issue, your app needs to be whitelisted from Power Saving mode under Settings > Battery .

Other Information



System Requirements

HERE Android SDK is designed and tested with Android phones and tablets in mind. SDK performance will vary between devices, since it is primarily determined by CPU, GPU, and display resolution. Currently, Nexus 5 is a suitable reference for a device which delivers acceptable SDK performance. If your target device is not a phone or tablet, see *Service Support* to contact us for more details.

- Minimum supported API Level is 16 which corresponds Android 4.1.x "Jelly Bean". (android:minSdkVersion)
- Apps should be developed using Android Studio 2.3.2 or above. Android Studio 3.4 is recommended for optimal operation.
- For apps that implement basic use cases such as map rendering, search, and routing a minimum of 128MB of memory (RAM) is recommended to be available. More complex use cases, such as turn-by-turn navigation, require more memory.
- A minimum of 120MB per application should be made available for storing HERE SDK libraries
- A minimum of 100MB should be made available for storing map data
- Data connectivity (Wi-Fi or Cellular) is required to download map data and ensure map data is updated when new versions are made available
- Note: HERE Android SDK does not support x86 Android and x86_64 devices. x86 emulators are supported. It is recommended that testing is performed on ARM and ARM64 devices.

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(For example, a function in a library to compute square roots has a purpose that is entirely well-defined independent of the application. Therefore, Subsection 2d requires that any application-supplied function or table used by this function must be optional: if the application does not supply it, the square root function must still compute square roots.)

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If such an object file uses only numerical parameters, data structure layouts and accessors, and small macros and small inline functions (ten lines or less in length), then the use of the object file is unrestricted, regardless of whether it is legally a derivative work. (Executables containing this object code plus portions of the Library will still fall under Section 6.)

Otherwise, if the work is a derivative of the Library, you may distribute the object code for the work under the terms of Section 6. Any executables containing that work also fall under Section 6, whether or not they are linked directly with the Library itself.
